

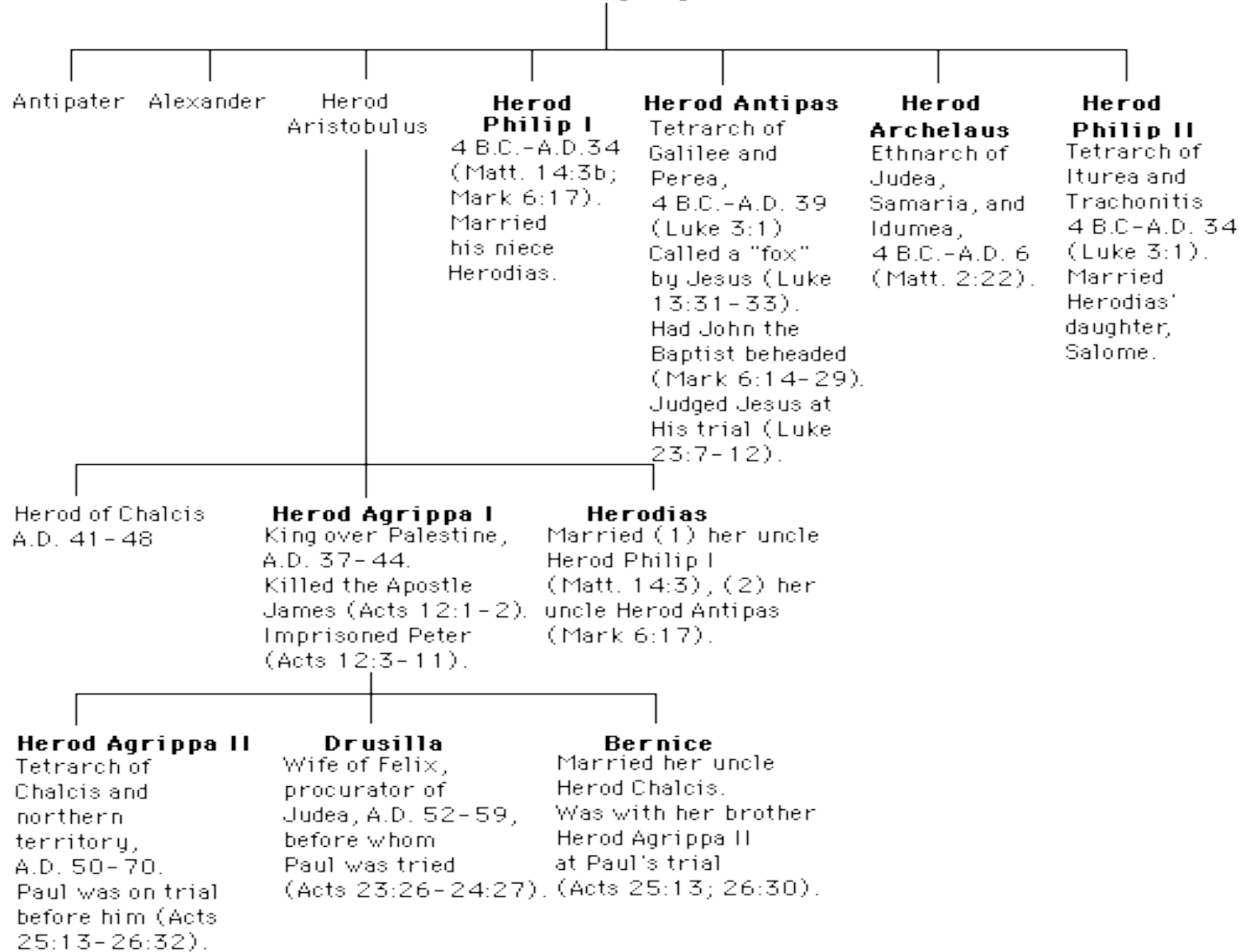

James, the brother of John - This was the son of Zebedee, Mat_4:21. He is commonly called James the Greater, in contradistinction from James, the son of Alpheus, who is called James the Less, Mat_10:3. In this manner were the predictions of our Saviour respecting him fulfilled, Mat_20:23, “Ye shall indeed drink of my cup....” He is the first Apostle to die.
